Here is a report just back from Colombia on our Freeze For Food find raising monies. The January, 1999, Freeze for Food fund-raiser resulted in sending \$2,200 to San Jose de Apartado, Colombia. The community (a part of Madison's official sister-city relationship) reports that half the money was spent on banana seedlings and the other half on food supplements for young children. The civil war raging around and through the community makes it very difficult to provide proper nutrition to children, and the people of San Jose (and the Colombia Support Network) thank the RPCV very much for their generous help. I'd like to run the FFF again this year with the group's approval.

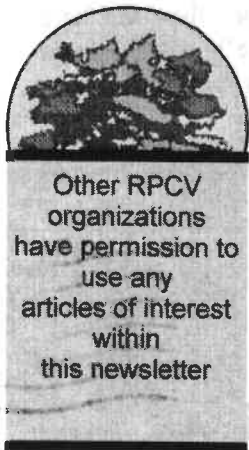
